Mental Health First AID

Representatives from various Ethiopian organizations in the community attended the Mental Health First Aid Training that was provided by the Office of Thrive NYC. The training prepares attendees to serve as first responders in mental health emergencies. There was guidance on how to support individuals experiencing mental disorders and how to access resources within the community to support their needs. Attendees received a two year certificate that will allow them to serve as first responders in times of crisis in our community.



2020 Census

The 2020 census will be conducted between mid-March and the end of July. This period is divided into two phases: the "self-response-only" phase and the "nonresponse follow-up" phase. By mid-March of 2020, every household in the United States will receive a letter from the Census Bureau with information on filling out the census online. During the self-response-only period, the census will be available online and by phone. At the end of the self-response-only phase the Census Bureau will send paper forms to households which have not responded online. For more information, please visit <u>2020 Census Website</u>
