Resume and Interview Skills Workshop March 10, 2019

with foreign trained professionals who were facing barriers of entry to the workforce in the United States in their fields of interest or training. Yayne Gebremariam, an HR professional with years of experience in Ethiopia and in the US, led the workshop. Attendees



shared their backgrounds, provided their resumes for critique, and explained their steps for approaching the job market in their fields.

We enjoyed hearing pertinent questions, commonalities in struggles with the job search, and honest feedback about how to refine and improve our workshop. We hope to host this type of workshop again, with specific information and resources to assist different groups of the Diaspora, such as new College Grads, professionals, mothers coming back into the workforce.
