Petros at the Hour, *Written by Laureate Tsegaye Gebremedhin*

Join us for a special production of *Petros at the Hour* by the Tayitu Cultural and Educational Center. In 1928, Abune Petros was appointed Bishop of central and northern Ethiopia. During the Mussolini's invasion of Ethiopia, he taught people to stand up against fascism and preached that God would visit the Ethiopian people soon. In 1936, he was arrested for treason by Italian soldiers and was asked to accept the Italian occupation. He refused the ultimatum and was sentenced to death. He is a true Ethiopian 20th Century Martyr. A statute of Abune Petros was raised in Addis Ababa 10 years after his death in honor of his sacrifice. Poet Laureate Tsegaye Gebremedhin has written a play documenting the last three days of his life. ECMAA and the Global Alliance for Justice are collaborating to bring this play to New York City on February 16, 2020 in their annual Commemoration of Yekatit 12. Mental Health First AID

It's hard to watch members of our community struggle with mental health and not know how to help. The Mayor's Office, Thrive NYC, in collaboration with ECMAA is offering a free program, Mental Health First Aid to the Ethiopian Community. Those who complete the full day training will receive a certificate and will learn how to give mental health advice. The goal is to have as many of us trained as possible so that each church/community group has a support system for our community. Taking the training does not commit you to anything....

The Benefits include:

- A two-year certificate that can be included in your resume
- Skills to recognize signs of anxiety, depression, suicidal thoughts and behaviors, psychosis and other signs of mental illness
- Concrete guidance on how to support someone with mental health problems
- Feeling confident about how to help someone who needs help (sometimes, it's just listening)

2020 Census

The 2020 census will be conducted between mid-March and the end of July. This period is divided into two phases: the "self-response-only" phase and the "non-response follow-up" phase.

By mid-March of 2020, every household in the United States will receive a letter from the Census Bureau with information on filling out the census online. During the self-response-only period, the census will be available online and by phone. At the end of the self-response-only phase the Census Bureau will send paper forms to households which have not responded online.

Within Ethiopian culture, “Gemena” and “Yelugnta” are concepts that can keep us from talking to each other and reaching out for help. If unconsidered, they can leave some of us alone and isolated because of a fear of being judged or talked about. On March 7th, ECMAA, African Services Committee, Ethiopian Edir Mutual Assistance Association, and Habesha Health will hold a workshop with Yelugnta and Gemena as an overriding theme. Topics that will be explored include Mental Health, Autism Spectrum and Intimate Partner Violence.

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In approximately mid-May, the Census Bureau will begin to send enumerators, or "door-knockers", to conduct non-response follow-ups for households that have still not completed the census. If no one answers the door after several attempts, the enumerators will either use administrative records or proxies to try to determine the information for that household. These estimates by enumerators are often inaccurate and can leave many New Yorkers out of the count, impacting our fair share of \$650 billion in federal funding for vital programs and our representation in Congress. That is why increasing the self-response rate is imperative to strengthening our ability to achieve a complete and accurate count next year.
